The tragedy of her father's death did not turn Carolina away from God but instead drew her to study His Word and strengthen her faith. The words she penned speak to the hope that is ours in Christ Jesus.

Her words proclaim our faith in the Gospel message as given to us in the Scriptures. For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16 ESV).

God His own doth tend and nourish; In His holy courts they flourish. From all evil things He spares them; In His mighty arms He bears them.

Though He giveth or He taketh, God His children ne'er forsaketh; His the loving purpose solely To preserve them pure and holy.
